Fun with Shakespeare

This workshop will be centred round the study of the section of a speech from one of Shakespeare's less well-known history plays, King Henry IV Part 2.

He has also been a member of the Green Room Club for most of that time and is now the editor of the GRC monthly newsletter.

How to get to Carlisle

By car:

If coming from the south, Junction 42 of the M6 for Carlisle South will be the ideal place to get off. If you miss it, the next Junction, (43) will take you almost to the same place. Once in the City Centre take the signs for "West", sometimes also marked for Workington, Keswick, and Cockermouth, but mainly using the points of the compass method. Once through the Citadel towers, the road takes you left after about 100 yards and the theatre is in the street which is second on the right. Look for Tesco Supermarket and turn right there. There is a car park, (Head's Lane) which is second on the right and is "pay at the end of your stay". Alternatively look for the signs to the West Walls Car Park. This is free after six o'clock in the evening but take warning, it is

locked at 11.00 pm!!

If coming from the north, Junctions 44 and 43 of the M6 are equally good and once in town just take the signs painted on the road for "West" or "Station", from there you will pick up the route through the Citadel towers.

By train:

Carlisle is probably one of the easiest towns in England to get to by train, linking most major cities and centres. There is the west coast main line to London, Glasgow and Edinburgh, the Trans Pennine to Manchester, Manchester Airport and Liverpool, the Settle and Carlisle Railway to and from Leeds, the Hadrian's Wall line to Hexham, Newcastle and Morpeth, the Cumbria coastline to Workington, Whitehaven and Barrow and the Scotrail service to Glasgow via Dumfries.

By bus:

There are occasion bus services to London, Manchester, Glasgow and Edinburgh and an hourly service to Hexham and Newcastle.
